## Maine Events Ministry Statement of Faith

### We believe:

- That the Old and New Testaments were inspired of God, are infallible in the original writings, and that they are supreme and final authority in faith and life.
- In one God, eternally existing in three persons, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.
- That Jesus was begotten of the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, and is true God and true man.
- That man was created in the image of God, that he sinned and thereby incurred not only physical death, but also that spiritual death which is separation from God; and that all human beings are born with a sinful nature and, in the case of those who reach moral responsibility, become sinners in thought, word and deed.
- That the Lord Jesus died for our sins, according to the Scriptures, as a representative and substitution sacrifice and that all who believe in Him are justified on the ground of His shed blood.
- In the resurrection of the crucified body of our Lord, in His ascension into Heaven and in His present life there for us, as High Priest and advocate.
- That at any moment the Lord Himself shall descend from Heaven.
- That salvation is by grace through faith, and that all who receive by faith the Lord Jesus Christ are born again of the Holy Spirit and thereby become children of God.
- In the bodily resurrection of the just and the unjust, the everlasting blessedness of the saved, the everlasting conscious punishment of the lost.
- In the Church - - a living spiritual body of which Christ is the head and of which all regenerated people are members. We believe that a visible church is a company of believers in Jesus Christ, buried with Him in baptism and associated for worship, work and fellowship. We believe that to these visible churches are committed "till he come," the observance of the ordinances of Baptism and the Lord's Supper; and that God has laid upon these churches the task of persuading a lost world to accept Jesus Christ as Savior and to enthrone Him as Lord and Master. We believe that human betterment and social improvement are essential products of the gospel.

## CAMP 207 CODE OF CONDUCT - CAMPERS AND STAFF

1. Campers and staff are not permitted to possess and/or consume in any manner, or be in the presence of someone using or possessing legal or illegal drugs unless prescribed by a physician and registered immediately upon arrival.
2. Campers and staff are not permitted to possess or consume or be in the presence of someone possessing or consuming, alcoholic beverages of any type.
3. Smoking by campers and staff or in the presence of someone smoking is strictly prohibited (cigarettes, cigars, pipes, vapes)
4. No camper or staff shall act in a violent or aggressive manner, or cause physical assault, or cause to threaten such behavior. No camper shall tease, bully, or pick on another camper. No camper shall discriminate or say a racist remark or be perceived to do so. Passive indirect support of bullying and inappropriate behavior is also considered an offense. Campers (and staff) must be pro-active and take a stand to stop inappropriate behavior.
5. Campers are not permitted to leave camp property without official camp staff supervision, unless the camp has a) written consent from his/her parents and b) permission from the Director obtained by following the prescribed checkout procedures available only through the camp office.
6. All campers must abide by established curfews. If any camper is found out of their cabins after curfew the night before the last night of camp, a zero tolerance policy shall apply and such camper will not be invited back to camp next summer.
7. Male campers and staff are not permitted in female camper cabins, and female campers and staff are not permitted in male camper cabins, unless to attend an activity or with permission. NOTE: If campers are found in cabins of the opposite sex and is/are acting inappropriately (in the Director's sole discretion), such campers may be immediately dismissed from camp.
8. Campers and staff are required to attend all activities they have registered for and adhere to the daily camp schedule except when a) excused by a Director or b) excused for reasons of health by the camp medical staff.
9. Willful damage and/or defacing camp property, and theft are serious offenses. All campers and staff are expected to treat all property with care and respect other's personal property. This includes writing in cabins or buildings.
10. No campers and staff are permitted to possess or use fire, candles, mosquito coils or fireworks of any kind anywhere.
11. No camper is permitted to possess a knife or any kind of other sharp or dangerous tool or weapon, real or fake.
12. No campers and staff are permitted to tamper with any safety devices including fire alarms, fire extinguishers and/or fire buckets.
13. No camper shall bring to camp a cellular phone or use the camp phone without permission of the Camp Director. No camper shall bring any portable electronic device to watch videos, play electronic games, the internet or for communication purposes.

Disciplinary action for violating camp rules may include parental involvement, loss of privileges and/or immediate dismissal from camp. Loss of privilege examples are (but not limited to) the loss of activities such as tubing, swimming, snack shack.

Any infraction of Camp 207 policies may prevent a camper from returning to camp in the future.
